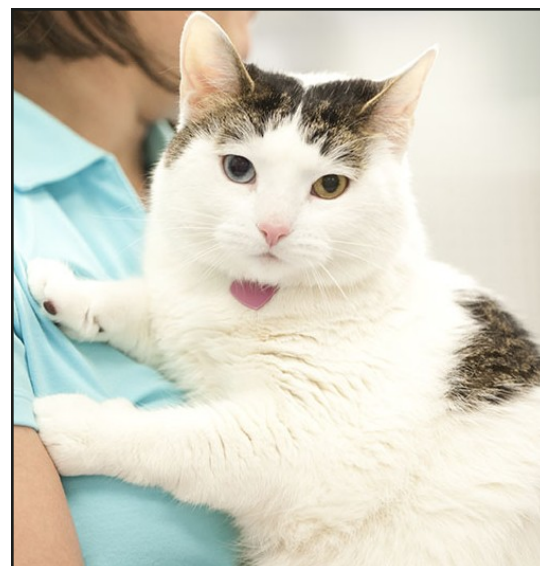




Radioiodine (¹³¹I) Treatment for Feline Hyperthyroidism

FAQ'S ON IODINE-131 AT BEVS

WHEN CAN MY CAT BE SEEN AT BEVS?

We can schedule the initial consult Monday -Thursday, however, actual treatment may not occur on the same day if space in the ¹³¹I room is not available.

IS IT EFFECTIVE?

More than > 95% cured with a single treatment.

IS IT SAFE FOR MY CAT?

Less than < 5% develop any side effects.

WHAT TESTS NEED TO BE DONE PRIOR TO THE ¹³¹I TREATMENT?

Your veterinarian will perform a CBC, Chemistry panel, UA, T4 (off methimazole for 7 days at least) and whole body x-rays within 3-4 weeks of therapy.

SHOULD I STOP MY CAT'S THYROID MEDICATION?

Patients need to be off methimazole for at least 7-14 days before treatment.

HOW LONG WILL MY CAT NEED TO STAY AT BEVS?

After treatment a short stay in the ¹³¹I room is required until radiation emissions reach a safe level. Most cats are released after 6 to 9 days of isolation.

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

Cost = \$1,067 (includes consult, radioactive iodine treatment, and hospitalization).

ARE ANY FOLLOW-UP TESTS NEEDED?

Recheck with your veterinarian one month after discharge for follow-up BUN, creatinine, and T4 tests.
